

Updated Public Health Order Effective Friday, October 23, 2020

The state will issue an extended emergency public health order effective Friday, Oct. 23, which incorporates the following amendments intended to root out and prevent the incidence and spread of COVID-19 at locations identified as sources of possible exposure:



- Businesses with four <u>rapid</u>
   <u>responses</u> over a two-week period will be required to close for two weeks.
- All retail establishments must close by 10PM every night, as must food and drink establishments serving alcohol.
- Food and drink establishments must complete the <u>New Mexico Safe Certification</u> <u>training program</u> by October 30th in order to continue offering indoor dining at 25% maximum capacity.
- State museums and historical sites will close effective Oct. 23.


