New Mexico Wildfire Info

The state is working closely with multiple local, state, federal, and tribal agencies to battle several wildfires burning across New Mexico this week. Strong, damaging winds combined with ongoing drought and low humidity resulted in conditions that caused wildfire to rapidly spread.





<u>Las Vegas Community Forum "Rebuilding & Reinvesting in Our Communities"</u>

April 28, 2022

MainStreet de Las Vegas is hosting a community forum on April 28 with NMMS Property Redevelopment Revitalization Specialist Rhea Serna and South Valley MainStreet's Executive Director Bianca Encinias. They'll present "Rebuilding & Reinvesting in Our Communities: Finding Resources, Working Together, Making a Difference" and discuss anti-displacement strategies that help keep families and long-term residents in their homes.

Bianca will share details of the South Valley Main Street's *Age in Place Program* that helps residents make critical repairs to their homes. Rhea will review how rapid economic, and redevelopment forces are making small cities unaffordable and will present a case for intentional equitable development so that Las Vegas retains its community heritage and population of multi-generational families.
