Lovington MainStreet's Local Innovators Institute Food Accelerator Program Recognized by USDA Rural Development



Lovington MainStreet's Local Innovators Institute is now in its fourth cohort, training restaurant entrepreneurs on the business and art of running a restaurant without the risk of losing precious time and resources on new food concepts. Back in 2018-19, Lovington MainStreet's Executive Director Mara Salcido worked with her Board to develop the Local Innovators Institute program in order to



improve downtown Lovington's dining and entertainment district which is one of Lovington MainStreet's economic transformation strategies.

Lovington MainStreet received a **\$75,900** Rural Business Development Grant (RBDG) from USDA Rural Development (RD) in 2019 to purchase the food truck, and another **\$50,000** in RBDG funding in 2020 to continue the restaurant accelerator program. New Mexico MainStreet's Business and Entrepreneur Development Revitalization Specialist Sean O'Shea (<u>Hatchform</u>) provided technical assistance to support the development of the business curriculum used in the five-week training. The training portion of the program also includes information on restaurant knowledge,



branding/marketing, menu development, business planning, food safety, and licensing. Entrepreneurs then spend two weeks in the food truck selling their product, getting hands-on experience and valuable feedback.

"I appreciate being in this community because there's so much potential here. Thank you to my Board, our Assistant Director Star McKee, the City of Lovington, and USDA RD for all their support. Please join us in downtown Lovington – hopefully we'll see you at our next event," said Lovington MainStreet's Executive Director **Mara Salcido**.



On May 19, 2023, USDA RD's State Director Patricia Dominguez presented Lovington MainStreet with a certificate of congratulations for "its successful Local Innovators Institute which supports the creation of business entrepreneurship by providing training and opportunities for those seeking to go into the restaurant business."

"Everything we do at USDA RD is to empower rural communities. We have business and industry programs locally and nationally to support small businesses in rural areas. - Infrastructure improvements that transform downtown such as **Storybook Park** and wayfinding signage
- Off the Clock Connections networking workshops
- *Shop Local* merchant promotions
- Live in Downtown music events
- Annual Smokin' on the Plaza BBQ community event
- Renovation of the historic **Lea Theater** which will house Lovington MainStreet's offices when complete.

Raton MainStreet Arts & Cultural District's

Wayfinding program has been so successful, we recently started the second phase which extends the reach of the signage to mark more spots for tourists. We installed signage that leads people to Climax Canyon nature trails, an outdoor recreation spot next to our downtown. We also installed signs by the two new downtown EV charging stations (installed by Raton Public Service Co.) directing people to 1st Street and our renovated Great Blocks area. We've received lots of great feedback on the signage,



and it helps us capture tourists and encourage them to stay in our MainStreet Arts & Cultural district.

Starting in late June, we have three back-to-back annual events that are really big for us so we're very busy and excited!

Our biggest fundraiser of the year is the <u>Annual</u> <u>Sun Valley Rides Summer Carnival</u> on **June 22-25, 2023**. Tickets can be purchased at InBank locations in Raton and Trinidad, CO. It's a very popular event and we're looking forward to having lots of fun that week.

After the carnival, we'll host our annual International <u>Santa Fe Trail Balloon Rally</u> on **July 1-3, 2023** at the La Mesa airfield. The mass ascensions on the mornings of July 1-3 are free to the public and are usually attended by hundreds of visitors every year.

After the Balloon Rally, we'll host the annual **Fourth of July** celebration, <u>Fun on Historic 1st</u> <u>Street</u>. This is a very popular event that will have a parade at 1:30pm, a vendor fair from Noon to 6:00pm, and a firework show in the evening. The top three parade floats will be awarded **MainStreet Bucks** to spend at local businesses – about 30 local businesses participate in the program and they display a sign in their front window advertising MainStreet Bucks. We've





had the MainStreet Bucks program for about four years, and it's added more than **\$7,000** back into our local economy – that's money that did not leak from Raton, it's stayed local! NMMS Graphic Designers Leighton Moon designed the Bucks which

come in \$5 increments.

During Labor Day weekend, Raton MainStreet is home to the <u>Gate City Music Festival</u> on **September 2-3, 2023**. The headliner, Mark Wills, will perform at the historic Shuler Theater and there will be free concerts on 1St Street all weekend.

We recently completed the planning phase of the **Raton Train Depot** Capital Outlay project, and we're excited to apply for phase two funding in the future. This project will restore the depot to its original glory and will house a Welcome Center for travelers. The City of Raton owns the Depot and we're thankful to work with them on this project because the renovated Depot will add to our Great Blocks on





MainStreet area. We're hoping this project will be complete in 2-3 years.

We're incredibly busy right now and we're so excited for all of these upcoming events and projects! Come visit us in Raton MainStreet Arts & Cultural District to see for yourself how welcoming and enjoyable our business district is to visitors and the community.

<u>Nob Hill MainStreet</u> just finished working on the massively successful **Taste of Nob Hill** event, which sold out online before the event! This event included 15 Nob Hill food & alcohol vendors, and live music.

We revamped our website to include a merchant listing section, and we also made sure all Nob Hill businesses have up-to-date Google listings.

Recently, we received \$5,000 from the City of Albuquerque to continue our music series which brings live music to district restaurants -- we're currently booking & promoting this.

We also partnered with the City to launch a Nob Hill employee parking program, alleviating the need for employees to park in front of businesses.

Our East Nob Hill string lighting project is nearly finished and final installation will be completed soon!

Nob Hill MainStreet has several new Board members who are excited to lend their expertise. This includes someone with a wealth of knowledge in city planning that's going to champion a historic wayfinding system in our district. We'll be ready to apply for Capital Outlay funding, when it's available, to get this project started.

We're co-hosting <u>Summerfest</u> on **July 22**, which we're always excited about. This free event includes multiple stages full of local bands, food trucks, and more. Bring the family, enjoy the fun, and celebrate Route 66.

Our district gift card funding is almost extinguished, and we look forward to applying for mural funding to beautify stretches of Bryn Mawr Dr.

We're very excited to see our social media blowing up. The amount of engagement we're









getting is better than ever!






